At 8:00 pm, the festival will present a *Color of Conversion* presentation of **HIGHEST TO LOWEST**, presented by **A24** and **Apple Original Films**, and directed by Academy Award® winner **Spike Lee**. Starring Denzel Washington, Jeffrey Wright, Ilfenesh Hadera, and A\$AP Rocky. The discussion will dive into the film's themes, creative journey, and cultural impact with Director Spike Lee and Ilfenesh Hadera.
